




In terms of population of Turkey,

1 in every 20 people is a refugee.





- Founded in Ankara in **1995** in order to assist refugees and asylum-seekers to produce solutions to the problems that they encounter in Turkey,
- **First organization** that used the term of 'asylum-seeker' in its name in Turkey,
- More than 1,700 employees in 80 offices covering 45 provinces across Turkey (social workers, protection officers, case workers, field workers, health educators, family consultants, psychologists, lawyers, peacebuilding officers, disability experts, language and skills trainers, interpreters, volunteers, administrative staff). SGDD-ASAM has representative offices in Greece-Athens and in Belgium-Brussels.
- SGDD-ASAM offers services to refugees and asylum-seekers regardless of their language, religion, gender, race, sexual orientation, age and political views.
- Our beneficiaries: Afghans, Iraqis, Iranians, Syrians, Somalians and asylum-seekers and refugees from more than 50 nations.
- Our Main Partners: UNHCR, UNICEF, UNFPA, WHO, UN Women, ILO and the EU.
- SGDD-ASAM is a member of Anna Lindh Euro-Mediterranean Foundation for the Dialogue between Cultures, United for Intercultural Action, ECRE and UN Global Compact.

Partner Registration

- In **January 2013**, **SGDD-ASAM** started to pre-register asylum-seekers (non-Syrians) for the UNHCR Turkey country office.
- From January 2015 to September 2018, partner-registration procedures were carried out by ASAM. As of 10 September 2018, UNHCR stopped registering foreigners wishing to apply for international protection in Turkey.
- Asylum-seekers were referred to their satellite cities after the registration and register with the local authorities after the referral and benefit from rights and services.
- In case of an identification of a vulnerability, ASAM Protection Unit conducted interviews and refered the case to UNHCR to accelerate the procedures with UNHCR and also access to local protection mechanism.



Protection & Psychosocial Support

Protection activities in order to assist urban refugees and asylum-seekers with respect to accessing rights and services are coordinated and supervised by ASAM Ankara HQ.

- Protection activities/services;
 - Social and legal counselling, UNHCR case management, psychological counselling,
 - Monitoring and providing psychosocial and legal counselling to vulnerable refugees, asylum-seekers and irregular migrants that are intercepted/rescued during the irregular border crossings and observing the implementation of Readmission Agreement,
 - Reporting pushback incidents between Turkish, Greek and Bulgarian borders.





Multi-Service Support Centers (MSC)

- These centers aim at providing several different activities for refugees with a «one stop shop» approach.
- Psychosocial counselling, social activities, peacebuilding and social activities, various courses (language, music, painting, etc.), trainings and non-food items and e-voucher card distribution are among the services offered.

Our teams consist of social workers, psychologists, nurses, disability experts, peacebuilding officers, interpreters, outreach teams and instructors.

Al Farah Child and Family Support Centers

Al Farah Centers are designed to provide services to children and youth in a safe and peaceful environment.

The overall objective of this project is to strengthen the protective environment for Turkish and non-Turkish children with a particular focus on the most vulnerable and hardest-to reach children.

Psychosocial counselling, social activities, peacebuilding and social activities, courses (language, music, painting, etc.), trainings on parenting, nutrition, etc. and non-food items and e-voucher card distribution are among the services offered.

Women and Girls Safe Space

ASAM has been providing services at 3 Women's Health Counseling Centers in **İstanbul** and **Hatay** which are established in collaboration with the UNFPA under the Project entitled Women and Girls Safe Spaces (WGSS). These centers operate in cooperation with the Provincial Directorates of Health.

Women and girls can receive information and services on reproductive health, women's rights, gender based violence and gender equality, psychosocial support, access to health services.







Refugee Health Training Centers

This project aims to improve access to quality and equitable health care for refugees and impacted host communities by empowering and integrating Syrian doctors and nurses in the Turkish Health System through the training programmes and providing health care to Syrains under temporary protection in order to reduce language barriers.

The project is carried out by United Nations World Health Organization (WHO), SGDD-ASAM, Ministry of Health (MoH) and the Public Health General Directorate (PHGD) in **Ankara**, **İzmir**, **Hatay**, **Mersin**.







Gaziantep Women-Only Center

A "Women-only Centre" in Gaziantep is launched in southeast Turkey, to offer livelihood opportunities for refugee and Turkish women and girls and provide them a safe space for dialogue and cohesion.

SADA Centre was established by UN Women, and is run in partnership with the International Labor Organization (ILO), the Association for Solidarity with Asylum Seekers and Migrants (SGDD-ASAM), and Gaziantep Metropolitan Municipality





Enhanced Support to Refugees Affected by the Syrian and Iraqi Crises in Turkey

This project aims to improve the reception, integration and protection of refugees and asylum seekers affected by the Syrian and Iraqi crises in Turkey through programs such as protection, health, social and legal counselling, psycho-social support services, disability focused services, social cohesion and integration activities, vocational trainings.

Within the context of this project, <u>Sustainable Living Centers (SLC)</u> in **Karabük, Ordu, Sakarya** and **Yalova**, and <u>Field Offices (FO)</u> in **Düzce** and **Kırıkkale** have been established; <u>Mobile Counselling</u> <u>Teams (MCT)</u> are operated for the cities where ASAM offices are not present.







Promotion of Economic Prospects for Syrians under Temporary Protection and Host Community in Turkey Project

The aim of the Project is to take initiatives towards developing the vocational and language skills of Syrians under temporary protection and Turkish people in need and to provide them with employment opportunities.

Through the trainings to be organized in 18 Public Education Centers (PEC) located in the provinces of **Adıyaman, Denizli, Diyarbakır, Istanbul and Tekidrdağ**, the goal is to reach a total of 1600 Turkish and Syrian beneficiaries.

Apart from language trainings and vocational courses, it is also intended to organize informative sessions on occupational health and safety, work ethics, culture and conditions in Turkey and work permits that refugees must obtain.



Traditional Cappadocia Women's Meeting

The 12th of this event was held in 2019 on the International Women's Day and the objective of the event is to form a common platform to encourage the solidarity between the local community and refugee women and bring together the local NGOs working for refugees and women.

Over 2,000 asylum-seeking and refugee women from different cities and nationalities (Syrian, Iraqi, Afghan, Iranian, Somalian, etc.) join this event each year to celebrate the International Women's Day and enjoy the unique beauty of the Cappadocia Region.

Turkey's First Refugee Film Days

Refugee Film Days was held in Ankara in 2015 where movies about the lives and struggles of refugees and migrants were screened in order to increase awareness about these situations.

Supporting Institutions: British, Norwegian and Switzerland Embassies, International Organization for Migration (IOM), Refugee Support Center (RSC-MUDEM) and Chaldean-Assyrian International Humanitarian Association (KADER).


